The Work-Study Program is the cornerstone of the Cristo Rey school model. Every student works one day per week in a professional environment at companies across the Greater Philadelphia area.

Local businesses and organizations hire students to do real work for real wages. The money earned at the job offsets approximately 50% of the cost of each student's education. In turn, students learn valuable skills and build a professional network that benefit them in college and in future careers.
