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Student Expectations: CRPHS Distance Learning

We recognize these are uncertain times, which leads to different responsibilities and challenges for everyone. We have taken these unusual circumstances into consideration as we developed these expectations for Cristo Rey Distance Learning. COVID-19 has impacted our lives on many levels, but we will get through this together.

As we now look ahead, we recognize that we need to make this our new "normal." In committing to our mission of "what's best for students," we will continue to provide a high quality college preparatory education with high amounts of support.

Learning Continues at Cristo Rey Philadelphia High School:

- Students will be held accountable to engage in the daily lessons provided by their teachers and complete all assigned work for *all* classes, this includes Business Literacy, Health & Fitness, College Counseling (Juniors only) and Art (Juniors only).
- Students must be engaged in the Distance Learning program, *and* Pass their classes for the year in order to move on to the next grade level or graduate.
- Students who are not engaged in the Distance Learning Program and/or do not pass their classes for the year will need to attend summer school, repeat the grade or fail out.
- Students must "attend" school in order to move on to the next grade level or graduate.
 - o Attendance: Recorded based on assignments completed by due date.
 - If a student does not complete their assignments by the due dates and did not communicate with the school about the missed assignments; the student will be considered absent. Students must "attend" school in order to move on to the next grade level or graduate. Parents and students will be called to discuss the "absence" and lack of engagement.

Students are highly encouraged to also attend Virtual Office Hours and Live Class Sessions provided by teachers. Please refer to the teachers' syllabi for more information.

Work Study Requirements:

To move onto the next grade level or graduate 1.) The students must complete their work-study assignments in a timely manner and 2.) They must participate in their phone check in with their supervisor from the work-study office.

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Work Load, Assessments and Grading Policies

A successful virtual learning environment must include changes to instruction as well as changes to norms and policies related to assessments and grading. Thus, we have decided to make changes to multiple areas of our grading and assessment norms and policies for the remainder of the school year. These policies will apply even if we are able to have classes back in our school campus before the end of the school year. **All policies/norms have been created to align to the challenges presented by a distance learning model while still maintaining the integrity and rigor of our school program.**

Workload:

- 30 minutes per class (includes lesson and independent "homework") per day.
- Students should expect, when limiting distractions, to spend between 2-3 hours a day, engaged in their lessons and school work. Every student learns differently, so it may take shorter or longer for some students.

Grading:

- Assignments are now divided into two categories: engagement and assessment. Teachers will assign at least 1 engagement and 1 assessment task a week.
- Teachers will apply points to each assignment based on the complexity of the assignment. Teachers will explain this in each class.
- All academic infractions (due to missed deadlines or academic dishonesty) still apply.

 - o Final Grades will be submitted to Powerschool no later than June 7th
