

T3 Grading Policy

(2019-2020 school year)

We have expected students to participate and be engaged in their learning. We have asked students to work as hard as they can based on what their schedule/commitments/responsibilities during COVID-19 allowed. We are proud of them.

For this trimester our students' grades cannot hurt them; their grades can only improve their current average.

For example...

- If a student were to fail T3 in English, but prior to COVID-19 earned an 80 average in that class from their first and second trimester grades, then we would enter the 80 as their T3 grade instead of the failing grade.
- If the student performed well during T3 in English, and their T3 grade is higher than their 80 average from their T1 and T2 average, then the student will keep their T3 grade since they earned that higher grade.

Looking ahead...

Students who had a failing average in a class for both T1 and T2, and then also failed T3.

- If a student fails 1-2 classes for the year they will go to summer school for those classes. Seniors will need to attend an accelerated summer school the week of May 26th.
- If a student fails 3 or more classes, then the Principal/Assistant Principal will have a conference with the student and family to discuss next steps based on guidance from their grade level teachers and performance on their T3 Final Assessments.
- Failing 3 or more classes could result in failing out or repeating the grade level in certain circumstances.
- A student must pass summer school for all subject areas in which they are enrolled.
 - Goal of summer school: remediation of skills and content to prepare for the next grade level.

Students who had a passing average in a class for both T1 and T2, and then failed T3 even when still submitting T3 work.

- Due to COVID-19, there are a variety of reasons why a student may fail T3.
- We will instill the Do No Harm policy.
- Reminder: T3 grades cannot hurt the student; T3 grades can only improve their current average.

Students who had a passing average in a class for both T1 and T2, and then failed T3 because they did not submit a majority of T3 work.

- Due to COVID-19, there are a variety of reasons why a student may not have completed assignments and been engaged in T3 work.
- We will instill the Do No Harm policy.
- Reminder: T3 grades cannot hurt the student; T3 grades can only improve their current average.
- Since the student failed a class in T3 due to lack of engagement, they must complete missed work for each failed class that will enable them to pass the class (earn a 70). Students will be notified by phone after final assessments about these expectations.
- Students will complete their missed work starting right after exam week (the week of June 8th).
- In the new school year, these students will also develop an academic growth plan at the start of T1 with our Academic Support Team to ensure they have the necessary skills to be successful in a possible Virtual Learning environment at the start of 2020-2021 school year.
